Dear All

As I am writing this, the Remembrance Season is nearly over and Advent and Christmas cast their first shadows into everybody's lives. Christmas chocolates and tinsel in the shops, carols and Christmas songs in the streets, charities getting ready to sell their cards are all unmissable hints that the festive season is close at hand. And we at St James are no exception: we are already preparing for our Christmas Fayre and nativity, where we hope to see many of you. It is a busy time of the year, a time of excitement and anticipation but also a time of waiting, a time for patience.

The word advent comes from the Latin verb advenire, to arrive or to reach and I have always found the second meaning particularly apt. During the season of advent, while we wait for the arrival of our saviour Jesus Christ, we already reach out to the child in the manger, we get ready for Him. Christmas trees are decorated, the wooden manger is dusted off, candles are lit on the advent wreath – all signs that Christmas is not just about presents and Christmas dinners, all symbols to point to something altogether more significant and magnificent: a new beginning, a child that will change the world, a child that is the light of the world.

This new beginning – like any new beginning really - starts with hope, hope that something is going to change for the better, hope that this new beginning will make a real difference, has an impact on our world, on our lives. And as Christians it is our privilege to set our hope on the child in the manger, a child born to be the King of Kings, a child born to save the world, a child that brings hope and light into our broken world: hope for justice, hope for peace, a hope that the prophet Isaiah expressed when he said: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end" (Isaiah 9, 6-7). AMEN

A PERSONAL NOTE

Some 9 months ago I announced my decision to leave St James by the end of 2023 and so you might be wondering why a removal van has not yet been sighted at the manse. This is because the implementation of presbytery plans across Scotland takes a little longer than I had anticipated, and vacant charges elsewhere are simply not yet allowed to call a new minister. I do not anticipate this to be a long delay, but it would not be fair on you to give you a new date that may have to be changed in one direction or the other.

This does not materially change what I have announced a few months ago: that I intend to leave St James, so the union with St Quivox can take place. I will add a word of caution, however: The union will not take place immediately: a Basis of Union will have to be negotiated, a vote will have to take place and presbytery's approval will have to be sought. These things take time, and a time of vacancy will be inevitable. I hope that patience and trust in God will get the congregation of St James through this period of change.


We held a Hallowe'en Quiz on Tuesday 24th October and raised £150, which we donated to the Church. Thanks to everyone who supported this event.
