Getting Crafty

Crown

Christians believe Christ is king. Make a crown

You will need: Card or foam sheets, Scissors, Glue, A stapler, pens, Sequins, gems etc to decorate, tin foil (optional)

- First take some stiff card or foam sheets and cut a wide strip with zig zag edges. It needs to be long enough to go round your head. You might like to cover it with tin foil to make it look metallic.
- Measure the strip round your head and staple the ends together to make sure it is the right size. You can just try it on. Decorate
- Cut two long thin strips of the card or foam. Staple one from the front of your crown base right to the back to make a crown and make a loop sticking up from the base, almost like a basket handle. Then add the other strip in the same way this time starting from the side this time, so that the two strips cross over. Decorate
- You can cut a cross shape to stick onto the very top of your crown for added effect.



The World

Christians believe that Jesus is king of the world. Make the world

You will need: Cardboard circles or paper plates, blue and green tissue paper (cut into 2x2 squares), Glue

- Take a paper plate or a circle cut out of white cardboard and a bunch of tissue paper squares.
- Brush a layer of white glue onto the circles, and then stick down their squares of tissue paper. You can choose to lay your squares of tissue flat or crumple the tissue paper before sticking them down.





Fun and Games

Note: these games are not suitable, when one family member is ill

Crown Race

You will need: a pile of hats, at least two people playing

- Gather as many hats as you can find in the house
- Make them into two equal piles at one end of the room (or three if there are three people playing)
- With your siblings or parents, stand at the other side of the room opposite the hats
- Race to the hats, put one on, race back, take it off
- Repeat until all hats are on the opposite side of the room, the first to have the whole pile at the opposite end wins



Musical Crowns

You will need: hats (one less than there are players), music

- This game is a bit like musical chairs or pass the parcel but as the music plays, you pass the hats around (1 hat less than there are players) until the music stops
- The player without a hat, when the music stops is allowed to take one hat away and take a seat (so there will still be one hat less than there are players).
- Repeat the game until only one player has a hat. The winner is the last player who still has a hat



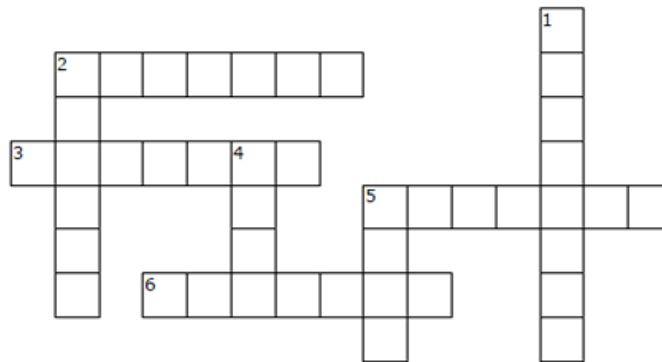
Puzzle it out

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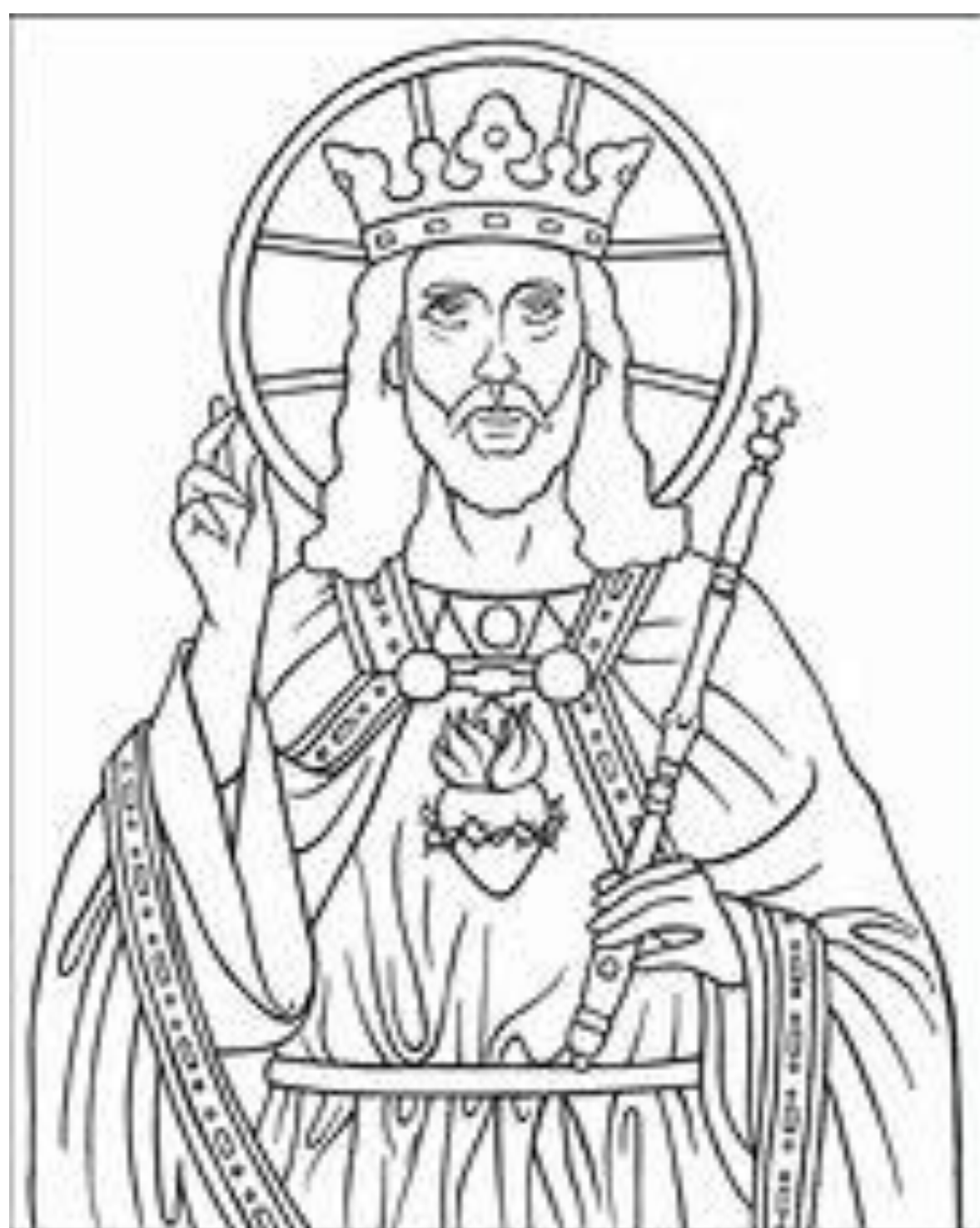
